# Thank you for joining us at NAIDOC Family Day!

Our annual NAIDOC Family Day was held on Thursday 10 July at the Aborigines Advancement League. This was the first time in the event's 24-year history the event was not held on the Wednesday at Collingwood Children's Farm. Despite this and forecast wet weather, around 1200 guests joined us on the day.

We were supported in the event by grants from the NIAA and City of Darebin and volunteers from KraftHeinz, NAB, Collarts and donations from dozens of organisations.

Traditional Owner Thane Garvey performed a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony, followed by song and dance performances from Djirri Djirri, Indigenous Outreach Projects, and speeches from the AHV CEO, Darren Smith and City of Darebin Mayor, Cr. Kristine Olaris OAM. The entertainment was closed out with an incredible interactive show by Mitch Tambo. The arts and crafts and storytime were packed all day, and we had great engagement with the five on-ground activities – boomerang throwing, football, netball, softball and soccer.

The feedback from the event and particularly the new venue has been overwhelmingly positive, and we are likely to return to the League next year.

































## 2025 Community Consultation Report

We recently completed another round of eight consultations as a part of our ongoing efforts to improve how we listen, connect and respond to renters, community members and local organisations. This time, we held sessions in: Broadmeadows, Echuca, Frankston, Geelong, Morwell, Ringwood, Shepparton and Warrnambool. At the consultation sessions, we let renters and community members know about:

- how AHV has worked to improve maintenance processes since the 2024 consultations;
- new community engagement opportunities like the renter portal; and
- our work through AHV's leadership and secretariat roles within Mana-na woorn-tyeen maar-takoort, Victoria's Aboriginal Housing and Homelessness Policy to increase the supply of housing for community

Renters and community members were also surprised to learn that AHV does not receive any ongoing government funding for its housing tenancy management and maintenance services, as AHV's ongoing funding is solely from the rents received. The key issues raised by renters and community members were:

- · The urgent need for more housing, both long and short term, and housing in a range of sizes.
- Improving maintenance, with much of the feedback related to the delays, rather than works not being done.



Victorian households will get a helping hand with energy costs this winter. The Energy Bill Relief Fund has been extended, with most people automatically receiving two \$75 rebates.

On top of that, the Power Saving Bonus is back. Eligible concession card holders can apply for a one-off \$100 payment. All you need is a recent electricity bill and one of the following cards: Health Care Card, Pensioner Concession Card, or a Veterans' Affairs card. Only one payment is available per household, and you can apply through the Victorian Energy Compare website.
